PARKING ISSUES

We are increasingly being informed about issues relating to unsafe and erratic driving close to our school by parents picking up children and also about unsafe parking.

Yesterday there was an accident outside the school, and whilst it was relatively minor and only involved cars—it could quite easily have been a child that was injured.

As stated before, we have a goodwill arrangement with the church that allows parents to park in the area directly outside the church for a limited period if they are displaying a slip indicating they are dropping off/picking up.

This arrangement does not extend to Mount Dinham, It does not mean that we can obstruct local residents from accessing their homes and it does not mean that we have a right to park on double vellow lines.

The residents of Mount Dinham pay a private company to patrol the area for them and to give out parking fines to anyone who is parking in an area or way that is not compliant with the agreement. We will be asking that company to step up their patrol of the area in order to prevent further accident or injury.

Can I please request that you park with care, ensuring that you do not park on double yellow lines, do not obstruct pavements/ house entrances. It is our hope that we can co exist with our neighbours and ensure the safety of the
