



School re-opening plans June 2020

We have put this together to help parents understand the measures that we have in place to facilitate a safe opening of our school

Our Priorities

- ▶ Minimise risk of Covid-19 infection in and around school
- ▶ Provide a safe environment where pupils at key transition points (Reception/Year1/Year6) can re-integrate.
- ▶ Ensure that vulnerable and EHCP pupils can return
- ▶ Provide places for the children of key workers
- ▶ Provide learning based on a recovery curriculum
- ▶ Maintain remote learning (SeeSaw) for children who remain at home

Key Workers Children Arrive 9.00 - 9.10am (Front gate) Depart 3.00pm (Front gate)

Reception Arrive 9.00 - 9.10am (Rockside gate) Depart 3.00pm (Rockside gate)

Y1 Arrive 9.20 - 9.30am (Rockside gate) Depart 3.15pm (Rockside gate)

Y6 Arrive 9.20 - 9.30am (Front gate) Depart 3.15pm (Front gate)

Social distancing spots on the playground help the children and their families know where to stand whilst waiting

Cleaning



- ▶ All frequently touched surfaces, equipment, door handles and toilets used during the day will be cleaned regularly throughout the day
- ▶ Children will be taught what to do and how to clean their own equipment
- ▶ Staff will clean any resources after use and will regularly wipe all surfaces

Hygiene and Safety

- ▶ Rooms are kept well ventilated (windows open in warm weather etc)
- ▶ Regular handwashing
- ▶ Hand sanitiser and soap available in all wash areas (toilets/classrooms etc)
- ▶ Reduce ‘touch points’ (light switches etc)
- ▶ Library closed
- ▶ Reminder posters around the school
- ▶ Doors wedged at entry/exit times



PPE & Protection

- ▶ Government guidance does not promote the use of PPE in education settings other than for specific reasons - instead it promotes good hand hygiene and social distancing
- ▶ PPE is provided for staff dealing with medical and intimate care
- ▶ All staff have received training re the use of PPE in schools
- ▶ The use of PPE (inc face mask) is recommended when:
 - ▶ Moving, isolating or supporting a child with symptoms of COVID-19
 - ▶ Cleaning an area where a child with suspected Covid-19 symptoms has been
 - ▶ Working with children whose care routine already involves the use of PPE

Pupil Groups

- ▶ 4 groups of children - (no more than 15 children in any group)
 - ▶ Reception (Ruby REEF POd)
 - ▶ Y1 (Emerald Evergreen Forest Pod)
 - ▶ Y2/3/4 Key worker (Sapphire Sparkling Sea Pod)
 - ▶ Y6 (Diamond Desert Pod)
- ▶ Adult:child ratio < 1:15 (government stipulated ratio)
- ▶ Adults do NOT move between pods
- ▶ Children do not mix with children from other pods



Resources

- ▶ Sharing of resources is minimised
- ▶ Only resources that can be easily cleaned are used
- ▶ Each child Y1-6 has their own table top bag of pens/pencils
- ▶ Children Y1-6 have their own work space/table
- ▶ Resources do not pass from home to school (or vice versa)
- ▶ Staff have allocated time for cleaning resources



Social distancing & Supervision

- ▶ Social distancing reminders are displayed everywhere around the school
- ▶ Staff provide reminders frequently (as required)
- ▶ Adult:child ratios enable staff to take breaks/ fulfil cleaning routines etc without introducing additional staff to the pod



Lunch Arrangements

- ▶ Catering - cold food only in June for pupils and staff
- ▶ Lunches delivered to pods, children eat in pods
- ▶ Lunchtime shortened to 30 minutes per group
- ▶ Field and playground to be used so that each pod has their playtime alone

Other Changes

- ▶ Updated behaviour policy
- ▶ Updates Safeguarding policy
- ▶ NO resources/books etc to pass between home and school
- ▶ School uniform to be worn with trainer - no changing for PE etc
- ▶ No PE Kit to be brought in to school
- ▶ Leeway to ensure children have clean clothes each day (even if this means they don't have full uniform)
- ▶ Cashless school - all payments to be made online

Curriculum

- ▶ Staff will invest time on planning activities which will promote relationships, reconnecting and team building
- ▶ Initial return to lessons will focus on safety, health and hygiene arrangements and wellbeing
- ▶ Staff will exploit opportunities to work outdoors
- ▶ Daily PE/physical activity (indoors or outdoors)

Curriculum inc. Remote Learning

- ▶ Daily focus on Maths, English, PE, PSHE + a range of foundation subjects (eg Art, Music, Geog etc)
- ▶ Curriculum in school to mirror home learning where possible
- ▶ SeeSaw to be used for children working from home
- ▶ Curriculum design to take into account pupil voice and needs - what do the children want to learn? What do they need? Is it the same for all pupils?
