Family Pride South West Project

The project has 4 components;

Family Pride Events – fun family events for families where at least one member is LGBT+.
 Parenting Support – We will be delivering Group Triple P for LGBT+ parents/carers with children between the ages of 2 and 12. This will be an 8 week course focussing on parenting skills.
 Family Relationship Support – Our family practitioners can work with families where there is tension or communication problems between parents (together or apart). This can include disagreements on how best to support an LGBT+ child in the family, or where a parent has come out as LGBT+ and they are unsure what this means for their relationship, as well as more general relationship difficulties.
 Couples/co-parent counselling – We will have counselling available for parents who wish to work through difficulties in a therapeutic setting.
