$\Rightarrow$ The school responds well to any concerns I raise $100 \%$
$\Rightarrow$ The school is led and managed effectively $100 \%$
$\Rightarrow$ The school makes sure my child is well prepared for the future $100 \%$
$\Rightarrow$ I would recommend this school to another parent $100 \%$
The area in which parents felt we fell a little short was in relation to behaviour - $90 \%$ of parents believe that the school ensures pupils are well behaved and deals effectively with bullying. Whilst this is not a worryingly low score, our aspiration is to ensure that we work with you to raise this to match the views in other areas. Our focus for 2017/18 is to review our procedures and practice so that we ensure all pupils in our school are safe and that their behaviour is well managed.
