What have we been doing this week?....

Ruby Class - Following on from learning phrases in Mandarin, Ruby class have been using the Chinese alphabet to write their own name. They have also been exploring music from China and other countries and thinking about how they made them feel!?

Wellington Boots

Online Safety-Fortnite

Fortnite is an online game, Battle Royale is a part of Fortnite where players do not have to pay to play. In Battle Royal, the free segment of Fortnite, 100 players compete against each other to be the last person standing in player vs player (PVP) combat. It has a PEGI rating of age 12, but because of the contact element children may be exposed to swearing and offensive language and text chat.

The minimum age for playing this game is 12 years, we are therefore surprised by the number of children at St David's who are playing - some as young as Y2 or 3. Fortnite is a Multi Player game, with an online chat option which can be turned off for players your child doesn't know. It is possible to team up with friends and form strategic alliances, this adds a social element. If your child is playing, please be aware of the dangers and the addictive nature of the game and do what you can to protect them. It is possible to set up a 'party' of friends to play with so that children can only communicate with people they know.
