The aim of the appeal is to send Christmas boxes of small gifts to children in Romania who would otherwise receive nothing during the festive period.

Christmas is an expensive time for us all but we are hoping that if we all tried to bring in a small item from the specified list we could put them together to make a number of completed gift boxes.

So that we have a range of items we are asking that Classes focus of different Categories:

<u>Ruby</u> – Small Toys for ages 5-9 e.g. skipping rope, musical instruments, bouncy balls, tennis balls, animal figures etc.

Items should be new/nearly new - Clean and intact

<u>Emerald</u> - Small cuddly toys, small dolls/ rag dolls, puppets or wooden/plastic people.

<u>Sapphire</u> – Art and Craft items (pens, glitter, rubbers etc.) or toiletries e.g. toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, flannels or hairbrushes.

<u>Diamond</u> – school stationary e.g. pens, pencils, rulers, exercise books, felt tips etc. or things to wear e.g. hats, gloves, scarfs, hair bands/clips, dress up items.

Moto in the Community


